


What evil lurks in the hearts of men?


in your heart, when you touch Starcraft's Eliminator.

a station wagon. These are the boats.


We can't tell you which runabout to choose. Or how to use it. But, if you're a man who expects more boat than he pays for, just say the word. Starcraft. To any dealer.
